House liquor and wild parties? \$4,174.20
Your students should be freaking out about this. Zelda and F. Scott were notorious alcoholics, but they were also generous hosts.

Entertainment, not including above? \$2,565
Be sure to include everything under this category, from club dues to theater to books/newspapers/flowers. Anything that looks fun goes here.

Ice? (Why so much?) \$197.12
Probably had an ice box instead of a refrigerator and, again, they were hosting lots of parties.
Plumber? (Why so much?) \$313.07
And what happens when people drink too much? Ew.
Total monthly expenses? \$55,563.24
Whoa! Fitzgerald was a successful writer, but he wasn't THIS successful. They lived
beyond their means, which was a huge stressor for him. Later in life, he tried to write Hollywood screenplays (which he hated) because he was so desperate for money.
Charity? What percentage of their total expenses went to charity?
$\$ 92.76$ Just about $1 / 100$ th of a percent was given to charity. Obviously, their priorities were askew.
